SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**



1. Rules

1.1 The races will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.

2. Entries

2.1 The event is open to all boats from SLVYRA member clubs. Boats entered in PHRF fleets must have a SLVYRA handicap.

2.2 Eligible boats must register by sailing past the stern of the race committee boat and hailing the boat's **sail number, class and division**.

3. Notices To Competitors

3.1 Notices to Competitors will be posted on the official notice board located on the veranda of each club.

4. Changes To Sailing Instructions

4.1 Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the official notice board of each club before 0830h (when the warning is scheduled for 1000h or 1100h) or 1600h (when the warning is scheduled for 1830h or 1845h) on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule will be posted before 2000h on the day before it will take effect.

5. Signals Made Ashore

5.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flag pole of each club.

5.2 The host club race committee will communicate these signals to its neighbour club by telephone so that the same signals can be displayed at that club: **PCYC (514 695-2441) BYC (514 695-1272)**.

5.3 When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 30 minutes" in the race signal AP.

6. Schedule Of Races

6.1 The scheduled time for the first warning signal will be **1845h, except for July 9 and 16: 1000h, Sept 6 and 8: 1830h and Sept 11 and 18: 1100h**. The warning signal for subsequent races will be as soon as practicable following the finish of the previous race. Repetitive sound signals may be used by the race committee to alert competitors to the starting sequence of subsequent races.

6.2 The course area will be located approximately 1 nautical mile southwest of PCYC.

7. The Courses

7.1 The diagrams in Appendix 1 show the courses.

7.2 Course designation and course signals are as follows:

Short Course	T
Full Course	No code flag

8. Marks And Starting/Finishing Line

8.1 Inflatable drop marks will be used.

8.2 The race committee boat will form one end of the starting and finishing line.

8.3 There will be two windward marks for all races; Mark 1 and Mark 2, set at approximately equal distances from the starting line, but separated by approximately 250 ft. Mark 2 will always be to port of Mark 1 looking upwind. **Mark 1 will be the windward mark for Divisions 1, 2, and 4. Mark 2 will be the windward mark for Division 3.**

9. The Start And Class Flags

- 9.1 The starting line will be between the mast of the race committee boat displaying an RC flag at the starboard end of the line and the starting mark at the port end.
- 9.2 **Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall stay clear of the starting area.**
- 9.3 The race committee, at its discretion, may modify the order of division starts shown below. Any such change will not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1(a).

10. Recalls

- 10.1 In the event of a general recall of one or more divisions, the recalled divisions will be started, in order, after the last scheduled start. This changes Rule 29.2.

11. Time Limit

- 11.1 Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat in their division sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF) without a hearing. This changes Rule 35.

12. Protests

- 12.1 Protest forms are available outside each club office. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered to the bar or Protest Coordinator at either club within the time limit. A list of Protest Coordinators is posted on the official notice board of each club.
- 12.2 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the race committee boat has docked after the last race of the day.
- 12.3 Notices will be posted on the official notice board of each club, within 10 minutes of being filed and no later than 10 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the board room of either club the same day or prior to the next scheduled race in the series.
- 12.4 Notices of protests by the race committee will be posted to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).

13. Scoring

GNS Series

- 13.1 Each series will be scored separately.
- 13.2 Two completed races is required to constitute a series.
- 13.3 If 4 or more races per series are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. If less than 4 races per series are completed, all races will count.

- 13.4 A boat that came to the starting area but did not start, did not finish, retired after finishing or was disqualified will be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of boats that came to the starting area. A boat that did not come to the starting area will be scored points for the finishing place plus two more than the number of boats that came to the starting area. This changes rule A4.2.
- 13.5 Competitors serving as race committee will be awarded average points for that race, based on their total points in the series.

Sail Week

- 13.6 Three completed races are required to constitute a series.
- 13.7 When fewer than 5 races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When 5 to 8 races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. When 9 races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
- 13.8 A boat that came to the starting area but did not start, did not finish, retired after finishing or was disqualified will be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of boats that came to the starting area. A boat that did not come to the starting area will be scored points for the finishing place two more than the number of boats that came to the starting area. This changes rule A4.2.
- 13.9 Competitors serving as race committee will be awarded average points for that race, based on their total points in the series.

Annual Regattas

- 13.10 The PCYC and BYC regattas will be scored separately.
- 13.11 One completed race is required to constitute a regatta.
- 13.12 A boat's regatta score will be the total of her race scores.
- 13.13 A boat that came to the starting area but did not start, did not finish, retired after finishing or was disqualified will be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of boats that came to the starting area. A boat that did not come to the starting area will be scored points for the finishing place two more than the number of boats that came to the starting area. This changes rule A4.2.

14. Prizes

- 14.1 Prizes will be awarded for the GNS Series 1,3,5 (Tuesdays), GNS Series 2,4,6 (Thursdays), GNS Fall Series, Sail Week and the BYC and PCYC Annual Regattas as follows: 1-3 entrants: 1st prize, 4 entrants: 1st and 2nd prizes, 5 entrants or more: 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes.
- 14.2 Determination of the eligibility for prizes in each division will be based on the average number of starters in each division in each event.

15. Retirement

- 15.1 Boats retiring shall notify the race committee on the water or by telephoning the host club immediately upon reaching shore. The club telephone numbers are: **BYC (514 695-1272)**
PCYC (514 695-2441).

16. Safety Regulations

- 16.1 All centerboard sailors must wear personal flotation devices while racing. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal flotation devices.

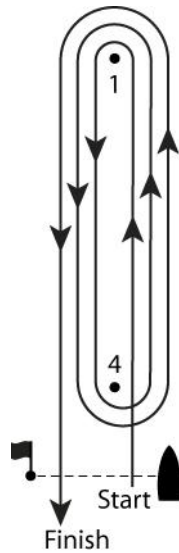
Full Course: No Code Flag

Full Course: Start-1-4-1-4-1-Finish

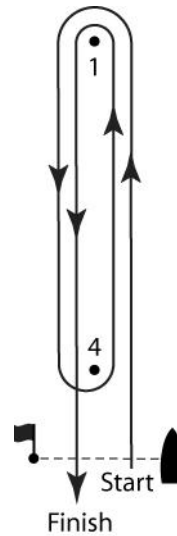
Short Course: Start-1-4-1-Finish

Full Course: Start-1-4-1-Finish

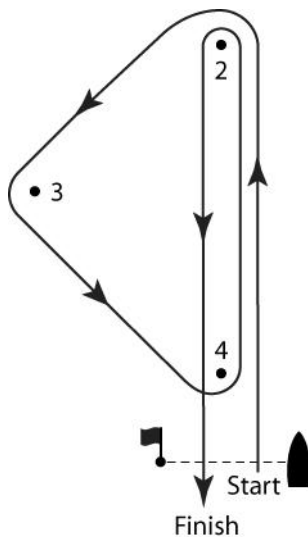
